Also, HELP line staff will call the AOC's personal cell phone if there is no pager response within 5 minutes.

Port Angeles Windstorm and Power Failure Dec. 14-15, 2018	provided to committee members after the meeting	A wind and rain storm knocked down trees and resulted in an electrical power outage in Clallam County. The Port Angeles Kidney Center was forced to suspend patient care until the following morning	COMPLETE	Clallam County public utilities department (PUD) noted on their website that water reductions or curtailments are possible during an electrical outage, i.e. municipal electric water pumps. Although this did not happen, the possibility of water utility loss should be noted by Port Angeles staff. Outage maps and other utility information is always available at <u>www.clallampud.net</u> for the region.
SeaTac clinic intermittent power loss. Thanksgiving Day Nov. 22, 2018	provided to committee members after the meeting	Electrical power was lost twice within 10 minutes in the SeaTac Kidney Center. The emergency diesel generator did not activate	COMPLETE	On 12/5/18, Cole added an addition to the scavenger hunt form so that employees will know the location and meaning of the generator monitor panel, if a generator is installed. Updates to the 2019 Orange Books include a table with clinic account numbers for water, gas, and electric utilities, the provider company, and phone numbers.
