Subject:	HIPAA Compliant Authorization to Release Medical Records
HIPAA requires specific information on an authorization form to release medical records. Without this information any request is considered invalid and the requestor will need to complete a Form HIM-A25001F – Authorization for Northwest Kidney Centers to Release Medical Information to a 3 <sup>rd</sup> Party.	
The Northwest Kidney Centers Policy and Form regarding the release of medical information can be found on Policy Manager under Health Information Management HIM.	
A HIPAA release form must be written in plain language and a copy of the signed form should be provided to the patient. A HIPAA-compliant authorization to release medical information form must contain the following information:	
☐ A descrip	tion of the information that will be disclosed.
☐ The purp	ose for which the information will be disclosed.
☐ The name	e of the person or entity to whom the information will be disclosed;
☐ An expiration date or expiration event when consent to disclose the information is withdrawn. For example, the authorization could state that it is good for 30 days, 90 days or even for 2 years. An authorization could also provide that it expires when the client reaches a certain age.	
individual's r with the pati	re and date that the authorization is signed by an individual or an epresentative. If a representative is signing the form, the relationship ent must be detailed along with a description of the representative's act on behalf of the patient.
The HIPAA re	elease form must also include statements that advise the individual of:
□ Their righ	nt to revoke their authorization.
☐ Any exce	ptions to the individual's right to revoke the authorization.
□ Details of	f how the authorization can be revoked.
	tment, payment, enrollment or eligibility for benefits for a patient is not n them signing a release form.

That there is potential for information disclosed under the terms of the authorization to be redisclosed by the recipient and may no longer be protected by federal or state law.
