#### Annual employee engagement survey is underway

We want to hear from you! Our annual employee survey launched on Monday and runs through April 4. The survey is a great opportunity to share feedback with Northwest Kidney Centers' leadership on what is going well and what could be improved. We heard you loud and clear in past surveys that you wanted your contributions to be recognized, and you wanted the organization to prioritize your well-being when making decisions. Thanks to your feedback, we implemented the following in FY25:

- Invested \$1 million in core salaries and wages
- Doubled funding for the Employee Scholarship and Tuition Assistance programs
- Created a pilot program that provides a pathway for foreign-trained nurses to move from DT to RN

#### The People Team launches Manager 101 series

This month, we're launching a new training series to support newly hired and promoted people leaders. The goal is to ensure all new leaders can access tactical training within the first three months in their new role.

The curriculum includes an overview with Finance on budgeting, invoice processing and payroll; IT for Power BI reporting, Communications for strategic goals and the People Team for hiring processes, interview documentation, behavioral based interviewing, ADP reporting, performance reviews, employee relations and performance management, leaves & accommodations, and PAFs.

We were saddened to learn of the passing of Col. James Manning, a beloved member of our community, a dialysis patient at our Federal Way East clinic, and a longtime NKC board member. His career spanned roles as a technical writer at Boeing, a teacher at Asa Mercer Junior High School in Seattle, and a salesman for IBM, before retiring from the Washington State Higher Education Coordinating Board.
